January is Radon Awareness Month

Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States after smoking.

Radon is an odorless and invisible radioactive gas naturally released from rocks, soil, and water.

In outdoor environments, radon levels are very low and generally not considered harmful. Radon can get into homes or buildings through small cracks or holes and build up to higher levels. Over time, breathing in high radon levels can cause lung cancer.

If you would like to get tested for COVID-19; contact Lisa Coakley, Clinical Health Supervisor to schedule a rapid PCR test.


