#### **Transportation**

Senior Center Buses may be used by any Berlin resident who is age 60 and older, or any person with a disability, 18 or older. These vehicles are equipped with a wheelchair lift and operate Monday-Friday from 8:30am to 3:00pm. \*Service is curb to curb: Riders that require assistance getting to or from the curb should be accompanied by a companion who can provide such help. Driver may use their discretion to determine whether or not transportation will be provided in the event that safety is a factor. Personal modes of transportation must be able to be secured, both in the front and back of the unit. In the case of Scooters, passengers must be able to transfer to a seat on the bus. \*Exceptions allowable for non-curb to curb service pending approval from the Director. \* The Town of Berlin applied for a cash grant for the purchase of a wheelchair accessible vehicle under the Section 5310 program that is administered by the Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT). The money is allocated to CTDOT through the Federal Transit Administration. CTDOT and the Regional Council of Governments throughout the state review applications and award the grants per region. The program is 80% federally funded with a 20% local match. The Town of Berlin is very pleased to have received such grant to be able to transport our seniors and disabled. Please note that due to increased usage, effective September 1st, 2024 Berlin Senior Center will be able to offer 1 ride per rider per day to and from a single location.

Regular Transportation Services are available for grocery shopping, pharmacies, banks, post office, town buildings, hair salons, barber shops, nail salons and specialty shopping in Berlin only.

24 business hours notice required.

Medical Appointment Transportation Services are available for appointments within our bus territory. 48 business hours notice required. We accept bus reservations up to a week in advance.

Bus reservations must be made during the hours of 8:30am-3pm.

Please remember to have doctor's address and time of appointment ready when calling to reserve a ride. Reservations left on the Center's voicemail will not be accepted.

Please make sure that you are ready 1 hour before your bus reservation time. Drivers should not have to wait. All calls for rides home must be made by 3:00pm.

Lastly, you are allowed two stops per day except when going to the grocery store.

MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION VOLUNTEER PROGRAM-The Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) provides seniors in our area a method of access to <u>free</u>, reliable, non-emergency medical transportation. Seniors requesting rides for the first time will call the RSVP Office and provide initial client information. From that point forward when they need a ride, they will be in the system and can call with their specific ride information. CT State Parks and Forests Passport Parking fees are now eliminated at Connecticut State Parks for those with Connecticut registered vehicles. To make this possible, an increase in registration fees was passed by the General Assembly. It is \$5 per year, which means \$10 for the customary two-year registration renewal for all non-commercial motor vehicles. Seniors 65+ with a one-year registration renewal will have only an additional \$5 fee each year. 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
