# Meeting Agenda

# 1. Audience of Citizens

- a. Lisa Deseno, 212 Beckley Road, is a representative for the ALS Alliance and they are requesting to do their road race again. Last year, there were at least 120 people and raised \$10,000. They had no issues with parking or any issues with people during the event last year. They are not selling any food on site, only give away snacks that are donated.
- b. Luke McCoy, KBA, discussed Demore, Dinda, Bittner Jr. Memorial Pool Complex. He recapped his presentation to the Town Council and updates made since that meeting. They discussed conversion of Tennis courts to Pickleball courts. They discussed a new playscape and park improvements. He was asked to accommodate the sizing of the Pool House Renovation and to compare building a new replacement for their needs. They discussed two structures for the playscape; one for ages 5-12 and the other for ages 2-5. They looked at modifications to the Pool House for pump requirements, bathrooms, and needed storage. This was going to be around 1.1 to 1.2 million which could increase potentially once renovations would begin. They were asked to see if it is more cost effective to construct a new Pool House. This would have bathrooms, storage, ADA accessibility, mechanical room for 1.1 to 1.2 million. The difference with this is with new construction there will be less potential for cost increase once the project starts. They looked at both pools, wading pool and main pool, demolishing to replace with a splash pad. This will be around 2.5 to 3 million. Will also need to refine parking when deciding on how many spaces wanted.

Commissioner Val Da Serra attended the Tinsel Run and thought it was great with a big turnout.
